Boil Water Advisory Rescinded for a Portion of the City of Syracuse, Hamilton County

TOPEKA – The Kansas Department of Health and Environment (KDHE) has rescinded a boil water advisory for a portion of the City of Syracuse public water supply system located in Hamilton County. The advisory was issued because of a loss of pressure due to maintenance. Failure to maintain adequate pressure may result in a loss of chlorine residuals and bacterial contamination.

The advisory affected City of Syracuse public water supply customers located north of Avenue B.

Public water suppliers in Kansas take all measures necessary to notify customers quickly after a system failure or shutdown. Regardless of whether it's the supplier or KDHE that announces a boil water advisory, KDHE will issue the rescind notice following testing at a certified laboratory.

Laboratory testing of drinking water samples collected from the City of Syracuse indicates no evidence of bacteriological contamination and all other conditions that placed the system at risk of contamination are deemed by KDHE officials to be resolved.
